This workshop will be a facilitated presentation of issues surrounding the response to requests for public records in all forms. Emphasis will be placed on the data built or acquired by public agencies that frequently form the basis for reports, findings, plans and maps. There will be time for questions and answers from the audience.

Purpose:	To provide guidelines for responding to requests for public records, whether in traditional hard copy (paper) or in electronic, digital format, such as data and imagery related to GIS.

Topics:	<p>The workshop will include, but not be limited to, the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • requests for data and requests for services, data and software • costs of data production versus costs of data reproduction • defining “the public” (is there a difference between a private or a commercial requestor?) • responsive data/records delivery (where records are requested) versus proactive data/records delivery (where records are delivered before a request is made, such as in Internet applications) • copyright or copy-wrong? • records restrained due to security concerns
