<b>9:10 – 9:40</b>	<p><b>Brian Fulfroost, UC Santa Cruz GIS Lab Manager</b></p> <p>The UC Atlas of Inequality attempts to present issues of global inequality through maps, graphics, tables, pictures, animations and text. It currently utilizes the Web to provide its knowledgebase and teaching resources to the widest range of users. The web provides an excellent medium for providing time series maps, animations and graphics but also allows more interactive learning. The Atlas is a web accessible user-driven database using PHP and MySQL as well as a user-driven GIS that utilizes ArcIMS and PHP to help accomplish these functions.</p>
<b>9:40 – 10:10</b>	<p><b>Jim Werle, GIS Specialist, Santa Cruz County Planning; Paul Garcia, David Burnett and Rich Westfall</b></p> <p>Santa Cruz County has developed intranet/internet applications for the Planning Department, Environmental Health, Public Works, and the Sheriff. The browser-based applications have made GIS data and analytic tools available to both the public and staff who previously had no direct access. The systems are heavily used and have resulted in significant savings in time and reduced the number of trips and telephone calls coming into the county for standard information requests.</p>

<b>10:25 – 10:55</b>	<p><b>Richard Semple, GIS Coordinator, City of Monterey</b></p> <p>The City of Monterey is developing an ArcIMS intranet noticing application for the Planning Division. It allows users to find and select parcels by a variety of criteria, buffer or select parcels, and create notices. This application utilizes parcel assessment data from the County in an ArcSDE database. The notices are created in Crystal Enterprise, also over the web, presenting a nearly seamless interface for the user. This application has saved the City money by dramatically speeding up the process of creating notices.</p>

## **Workshop Directions:**

### **Santa Cruz Police Department Community Room 115 Center Street, Santa Cruz, CA**

(Park in visitor parking lot. The receptionist will provide FREE all day parking pass)

#### **From the south (Watsonville, Monterey, Salinas) using Highway 1:**

- 1: Take Highway 1 north toward Santa Cruz.
- 2: At the junction of Highway 17 and Highway 1 in Santa Cruz follow signs to Hwy 1 North; this is known locally as the fish-hook. The stoplight at River Street the BIG Blue and Yellow "Welcome to River Street" sign should be on your left. Go straight ahead to the next stop light. The right lanes turn toward UCSC. Go straight ahead at this light. This is Chestnut. Go straight on Chestnut about 1/2 mile. Go past Maple. Next street and signal is Laurel. Turn left onto Laurel. Go two blocks to Center Street. Turn right onto Center. The Santa Cruz Police Department and parking are on the right.

#### **From the north (Halfmoon Bay, San Francisco), using Highway 1:**

- 1: Take Highway 1 south.
- 2: On the northern outskirts of Santa Cruz, Highway 1 becomes Mission Street. 0.94 miles
- 3: Turn RIGHT onto LAUREL ST. 0.57 miles
- 4: Turn RIGHT onto CENTER ST. 0.23 miles
- 5: Turn Right into SCPD parking lot, 115 Center Street.

#### **From the north (Los Gatos, San Jose), using Highway 17:**

- 1: Take Highway 17 South
- 2: Take the Highway 17 South exit towards SANTA CRUZ. 0.73 miles
- 3: Merge onto Highway 17 South. 26.18 miles
- 4: Take Highway 1 North towards Half Moon Bay/Boulder Creek. 0.19 miles
- 5: Merge onto Highway 1 N. 0.90 miles
- 6: The stoplight at River Street the BIG Blue and Yellow "Welcome to River Street" sign should be on your left. Go straight ahead to the next stop light. The right lanes turn toward UCSC. Go straight ahead at this light. This is Chestnut. Go straight on Chestnut about 1/2 mile. Go past Maple. Next street and signal is Laurel. Turn left onto Laurel. Go two blocks to Center Street. Turn right onto Center. The Santa Cruz Police Department and parking are on the right.

#### **From Highway 9 North (Felton, Saratoga):**

- 1: Take CA-9 s.
- 2: CA-9 becomes River St.
- 3: Turn RIGHT onto CA-1 N. 0.60 miles
- 4: CA-1 N becomes CHESTNUT ST. 0.57 miles
- 5: Turn LEFT onto LAUREL ST. 0.12 miles
- 6: Turn RIGHT onto CENTER ST.
- 7: Turn Right into SCPD parking lot, 115 Center Street.
